1. Permit Renewal Update –

- a. Final Permit was issued 10/15/2020.
- b. Notice of Intent/Stormwater Management Plan (SWMP)/ supporting documents are due to DEP 3/31/2021.
- c. Adds Permit Year 9 to the current permit (we are in Permit Year 8 now, and PY 9 will be 7/1/2021 to 6/30/2022).
- d. New effective date of next MS4 General Permit is 7/1/2022.
- e. Friends of Casco Bay Appealed the permit, we submitted letter as “Respondents” with ISWG.
 - i. We do not yet have a date for the Hearing with the Board of Environmental Protection. Brian Rayback will attend.

2. Maine DOT Update

- a. Issued a final Work Plan for projects that will be completed 2021/2022/2023 with a link to a graphic view of their location. (Kerem Gungor discussed) MS4’s can search the PDF for their town’s name and find projects that are planned in their area. The Maine DOT Public Map Viewer also has this information in a graphical format. Towns can reach out to Kerem for more information by providing him with the work plan identification number (WIN).
- b. Coordination letter updates: some coordination letters bounced back. This is a requirement when something changes and also in advance of submitting the NOI/SWMP for the new permit. Kristie has drafted a letter for SMSWG to use (see Attachment A to these Notes) and it includes the interconnected entities to send the letter to (please check your interconnections with transportation agencies). This coordination letter is required by the existing permit, and we did provide initial notice, but a few notices need to be updated. This coordination

notice is also a requirement for the NEW permit. So it would be good if each community could send out a notice. KLR can help if you need her to.

3. Stormwater Management Plan (SWMP) Update:

- a. Individual Plan finalization schedule:
 - i. York mostly done (was used for DEP confirmation of Public Education and Impaired Waters),
 - ii. Kittery – mostly done provided draft 1/26/2021
 - iii. South Berwick – ½ done, will send week of 2/1/2021
 - iv. Eliot – ½ done will send week of 2/1/2021
 - v. Berwick – will send week of 2/1/2021
- b. Illicit Discharge Detection and Elimination (IDDE) Plans and Quality Assurance Project Plans (QAPPs) will also be provided to Towns for review (hopefully week of 2/1 with SWMPs). Template is complete, and drafts have been prepared – KLR needs to review once more and update. These must be provided to DEP long with the NOI & SWMP.
- c. Other supporting documents to be submitted with SWMP and IDDE Plan (clarified by R. Poirier in 1/15/2021 letter to all MS4s):
 - Notice of Intent (KR will complete for you, needs Town Manager signature) R. Poirier clarified that the NOI asks for all waters that we discharge to, and which of those waters is impaired. She stated that if we need to, we can attach an additional file or document to list out all the waters (because the available space in the box on the form is small).
 - Proof of Public Notice must be filed in a local paper before the NOI is filed – suggest filing public notice on or around March 14th. See Attachment B for sample notice language - but it is not final. Action: Rhonda will double check DEP phone number for it. (KLR will provide to you when it's time to send this out).
 - Coordination letter with other interconnected MS4s See Attachment A and item 2 above, where we discussed it with DOT.
- d. R. Poirier provided a letter on January 15 with a list of items that need to be provided. Kristie emailed R. Poirier asking for clarity on a few items. One was regarding proving “SOPs”. R. Poirier clarified that the acronym “SOPs” is used in the permit, so it was included in the email that Rhonda sent out to us. Some MS4s have IDDE SOPs instead of Plans, so this was just meant to be a catch-all for those instances.

The other item needing clarity was discussed: written procedures for construction inspections. K. Rabasca said we have a BMP that says we will get those written in the first year of the permit. R. Poirier stated that was acceptable. R. Poirier also clarified that she is asking for more detail in the SWMP and attachments – for example, don't just say that you have a program to sweep roads, please be more specific than that, so it is clear what the aspects

of the program are and how it is implemented. K. Rabasca has attempted to do this for the MS4s.

4. ISWG/SMSWG Ordinance Committee / Maine Coastal Program Grant update and next steps

- a. First meeting was 11/9/2020 (J. Kellogg, L. Hinz, J. Brubaker, J. Bellissimo from SMSWG were in attendance)
- b. Decided to develop a model ordinance, and a checklist for ordinance changes. MMA assigned a lawyer (Michael Stultz) to assist with this ordinance, but the committee will still have to do a good portion of the work to modify the model ordinance(s) that are initially identified. Kerem is interested in assisting with this effort (K. Rabasca checked and K. Gungor is already invited to the next meeting of the Committee).
- c. Next meeting 2/8/2021 – review of final checklist and finalize optional climate change recommendations

5. Attendee updates

- a. Eliot – no update; we are moving forward with Post Construction Ordinance changes required by the new permit because the Planner was able to get them before Planning Board.
- b. Kittery – not a lot to report on, had a quite winter, used this time to do ditch inspections and maintenance
- c. York – working on reconstruction of Long Beach Avenue and Nubble Road project is planned for after Labor Day so we are doing the planning now
- d. S. Berwick – no update other than we have an Assistant PW Director now and some other new employees at the Town.
- e. Berwick – new fire station that was completed last fall with a 2-cell bio-filter; lots of training for the mowing and maintenance of this new BMP
- f. Others present: DOT (Kerem) – still negotiating our TS4 permit, had 2 meetings with DEP, 1 with Gregg and Rhonda and the other with Department of Environmental Assessment folks
- g. Andy (PNS): Jay is going out on medical leave but is still working on the permitting for the new dry dock(s) and waiting on the new MS4 permit
- h. Abbie (SMPDC): training planned for Climate Action Plan in late March or April – she will send out a flyer once that is finalized; also working with the transportation folks at SMPDC on LID and reached out to DOT and DEP – should be out late spring or early summer
- i. Rhonda (DEP); we are still working on the permits but we are thinking of May 31 for TS4 and June 30 for State/Federal NOI/SWMP submittals

The Municipality of _____ will file a Notice of Intent (NOI) to comply with the Maine General Permit for the Discharge of Stormwater from Small Municipal Separate Storm Sewer Systems issued 10/15/2020 (MER041000 W009170-5Y-C-R) and an associated Stormwater Management Plan (SWMP) with the Maine Department of Environmental Protection. The NOI and SWMP will be filed on or about _____. A copy may also be seen at the _____ municipal offices and on the municipal website: URL_____.

A request for public hearing or request that the Board of Environmental Protection assume jurisdiction over this application must be received by the DEP, in writing, no later than 20 days after the application is found acceptable for processing. Requests must indicate the interest of the person filing the request and specify the reasons why a hearing is warranted. Unless otherwise provided by law, a hearing is discretionary and may be held if the Commissioner or the Board finds significant public interest or there is conflicting technical information. The public comment period on the NOI and SWMP documents is a minimum of 30 calendar days.

Written public comments or requests for information may be made to the Division of Water Quality Management, Department of Environmental Protection, State House Station #17, Augusta, ME 04333- 0017 and must include the name of the municipality filing the NOI and the Permit number provided above. Subject: Questions on submittals for MS4 General Permit NOI and SWMP

Hi Rhonda and Gregg,

After reading your memo, those of us who are writing most of the SWMPs in the state still had a few questions. We met this morning to discuss this, and for the group (cc'd here), I am summarizing our current understanding and questions.

1. Items we will include with the SWMP and NOI:
 - a. IDDE Plan and QAPP (with IDDE inspection forms)
 - b. Notices provided to other MS4s (typically we put these in our IDDE Plans)
 - c. Proof of Public Notice (required by page 16 of the 2022 MS4 General Permit)
 - d. Construction Inspection Forms
2. Items we will not be including:
 - a. Written procedures for construction inspection - we have BMPs showing we will update or create these, and are providing a timeline to do so in the SWMP. The 2022 MS4 General Permit does not say when we need to have this done, so we are setting a timeline for it.
 - b. SWPPPs
 - c. M&O Plans (we call them O&M Plans)
3. Items we will only be including if we have them updated already:
 - a. Ordinances. As we discussed on 1/13, we will only include links to ordinances or ordinances in the submittal if they have already been updated to meet the 2022 MS4 General permit.
4. We are not entirely clear on what you mean by "SOPS". The current (2013) MS4 General Permit does not require any SOPs, and the only SOP required by the 2022 MS4 General Permit is the Visual Monitoring SOP for SWPPPs, which you informed us we do not need to include. So if there is something you are expecting besides the items above, please let us know as soon as possible.

RE: 2022 MS4 General Permit NOI and SWMP Submittal Information

Please read the following memo for information and action items related to document submittal under the 2022 MS4 General Permit.

The NOI is posted on the Department’s MS4 web page as a fillable PDF. (see **Forms** at <https://www.maine.gov/dep/water/wd/ms4/noi-2021-01-06.pdf>)

Applicants are required to publish a **public notice – not the completed NOI and SWMP** - that the NOI and a SWMP are being filed with the Department. The notice must be published within the 30 calendar-day period prior to the NOI being sent to the Department. The notice must be published in the legal advertisement section of a daily or weekly newspaper having general circulation in the area where the discharges authorized by this GP will occur and by making the notice available on the municipality’s official internet web site. Applicants are required to provide a letter of notice to all regulated small MS4s into which the MS4 discharges, and also to persons who have requested to be notified or interested persons to the respective applicants.

SOPs and Ordinances **do not have to be updated prior to the effective date of the permit**. However, if you have already updated any applicable SOPs or other required written documents, such as the IDDE Plan, then please submit them and we will review them now. Otherwise, we will review them in accordance with Part IV.B., second paragraph.

Inspection forms for applicable MCMs must be submitted with the NOI and SWMP. However, you do not need to attach the Quarterly Visual Monitoring Form or Quarterly Routine Site Inspection Form associated with SWPPPs.

You do not need to attach SWPPPs or M&O Plans but the SWMP should clearly state the facilities you have that require a SWPPP and that SWPPPs and M&O Plans are current and will be reviewed and updated prior to July 1, 2022.

Updated notification letters to your interconnected MS4s must be submitted.

The NOIs and SWMPs will be posted on the Department's web page shortly after being deemed complete for processing. The Department has 60 days to make that determination. They will remain on the Department web page for 30 days. The Department's public comment opportunity web page is located here: <https://www.maine.gov/dep/comment/index.html>.

*Clarification of MCM 4.a.i. of the permit:

MCM 4.a.i. states that Erosion and Sedimentation Control ordinances' ESCs BMPs must be consistent with those in Attachment C, Erosion and Sedimentation Control, Inspection and Maintenance, and Housekeeping.

Under Erosion and Sedimentation Control, 8.b, 9, 10, 11, and 12 do not apply to MCM 4.

Under Inspections and Maintenance, 2,3,4, and 5 do not apply to MCM 4.

When we review your SWMP and ESC ordinance or other regulatory mechanism, we will not be requiring these activities under MCM 4.
